HOLISTIC DEVELOPEMNT OF DEPRIVED CHILDREN:

Work for Equality has started three new PRERANA centers for tribal community children in Koregaon village. Approximately 120 children are beneficiaries of the program. Under the center we are providing them daily educational guidance along with life skills training, reading sessions, nutrition, yoga and sports. This program not only improving educational status of the deprived children but also increase their confidence level to mingle with other community children. These centers are supported by educated and sensitive local community women.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT: we found one of the tribe community is struggling to get water form many years. Due to lack of water availability young girls are not able to come to school and entire day they need to spend for collect water. We found there is a need of solidarity in the community to fight against water issue. To mobilize the community we are conducting meeting with villagers and understand them importance of harmony. These meeting are motivating tribes to come together and taking responsibility to solve problem.



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INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY: Work for Equality has celebrated International Women's Day with different programs with villagers and different company's employees. We organized four awareness talks for village women including PRERANA children parents on breast cancer as well as breast cancer checkup camp for four villages. Approximately 150 women got benefit of these programs. We also had fun activity, musical chair competition with participants. We gave prizes and plat for each participant to make their village atmosphere healthier. We also had sensitization workshop with Gabriel and continental India employees on status of Indian women. This workshop helped employees to change their negative thinking about gender equality.
